PAN-EUROPA IS 100 YEARS OLD !

In the 1950s, Richard Coudenhove Kalergi focused his efforts on renewing the pan-European movement. While he approved and supported the creation of the first European communities (EEC and Euratom), he constantly stressed, through various congresses and writings, the importance of not limiting union efforts to economic interests alone.

It was also he who inspired Aristide Briand to present his project for a European Union to the League of Nations in Geneva in 1929, a project which never materialised because of the deterioration in relations between the States.

It was he who convinced Churchill to launch his resounding appeal for European unity in September 1946 in Zurich. It was he who suggested the highly symbolic expressions of the adoption of Schiller's Ode to Joy to the music of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony as the European anthem (1929), the celebration of a Europe Day in May (1930) and the creation of a European postage stamp (1947)


PAN-EUROPA

In 2023 the International Pan-European Union celebrates the 100th anniversary of the publication of PAN-EUROPA, the book by Richard Coudenhove Kalergi.

This book was the first to propose a unification of the European states and described the steps to achieve it in very concrete terms.

Four years after the Treaty of Versailles, which led to the break-up of the German and Austro-Hungarian empires, it shows that only a united Europe can ensure peace and prosperity on the continent and confront the political expansionism of Russia and the economic expansionism of the United States. He made a reconciled France and Germany the driving force behind the future Europe he called for.

The fight against nationalism and the rights of minorities, economic and social concerns, the path towards a federal European democracy; the reflections of PAN-EUROPA are still relevant today.
